Dear Governor Barbour:

This letter is in regard to action taken by the Mississippi Board of Education concerning the Drew School District. The Commission on School Accreditation held a special-called meeting on June 14, 2011 to consider information presented by the Office of Accreditation, Mississippi Department of Education, regarding the District's impairments related to serious violations of accreditation standards, violations of state and federal law, a continued pattern of poor student performance in the District and serious concerns regarding financial resources. The Financial Advisor appointed by the Mississippi Board of Education in response to correspondence from the State Auditor and the Office of Policy and School Financial Services, Mississippi Department of Education, also presented information pertaining to lack of financial resources in the Drew School District.

Grave concerns raised by the information provided by Department staff required the Commission to consider its responsibility under Section 37-17-6 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. This consideration led the Commission to determine, as evidenced by its Resolution, that an extreme emergency situation exists in the Drew School District and that this extreme emergency jeopardizes the safety, security, and educational interests of the children enrolled in the schools of this District pursuant to Section 37-17-6 (11)(b).

The reports from the Department staff and the Commission's Resolution were presented to the Mississippi Board of Education at its June 16, 2011 work session. Due deliberation of the reports and documents led the Board to conclude that an extreme emergency situation exists in the Drew School District brought on by serious violations of accreditation standards, violations of state and federal law, a continued pattern of poor student performance and serious findings regarding a lack of financial resources, which jeopardizes the safety, security, and educational interests of the children enrolled in the schools of this District. At its June 17, 2011 meeting, the Board unanimously approved a Resolution determining that an extreme emergency situation exists in the District pursuant to Section 37-17-6 (11)(b).

The Board also unanimously approved a motion, pursuant to the same statute, asking you to declare that a state of emergency exists in the Drew School District. To that end, please accept this correspondence as the official request by the Commission on School Accreditation and by the Mississippi Board of Education that you declare that a state of emergency exists in the

Drew School District. Contingent upon your declaration that a state of emergency exists in the District, the Board unanimously approved a motion, pursuant to Section 37-17-6 (11)(c)(vii) and Section 37-17-13, abolishing the Drew School District.

Recognizing that this action is of the gravest nature, I am submitting the following documents in support of the Commission and Board request: a copy of the June 14th Resolution adopted by the Commission on School Accreditation; a copy of the June 17th Resolution adopted by the Mississippi Board of Education; and, a draft of the June 16 and 17, 2011 minutes of the Mississippi Board of Education.
